Helping Hands moms recently completed another successful semester on the road to financial independence. A total of 44 moms completed 486 college credit hours (11 credit average) with a cumulative GPA of 3.19.

During this period there were:

- multiple trips to the emergency room
- two moms who faced a loss of housing
- twenty-four auto repairs (a few of the moms had multiple repairs)
- a mom trying to recover from an injury caused by a car wreck
- one mom facing legal challenges from the children’s father
- the usual challenges associated with going to college, raising kids, and working.

Yet, the moms persevered through each challenge without taking their eyes off of the goal of a college degree and financial independence.

Spring Graduates

This spring Helping Hands watched ten moms cross the stage and receive their diploma. Five of the moms received AA degrees and will continue on for more education, one mom received a BA degree and will continue on for a MSW, four of the moms completed their education at ASU and we will be saying goodbye to them. Thanks to Blue Cross Blue Shield of Arizona, twenty-four single moms received a \$250 scholarship! Additional benefits for the moms included a free lunch

provided by the Maricopa Community College District and "I'm a Success" t-shirts.

The 5K Walk-N-Run for Success raised \$16,200 to assist low-income single moms as they pursue a college degree. The morning's activities included a 5K, live music, a large kids zone, game truck party, clowns, face painting, therapeutic massages for the moms, the Phoenix Suns Gorilla and ASU's own Sparky.
